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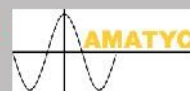

Change is in the air and all around us, so the theme of this year's conference is "Embracing Delta – Embracing Change"!



Presentation sessions and workshops will be conducted from 2:00 – 5:30 pm on Friday March 31st, and 9:00 am - 12:30 pm on Saturday, April 1st. *The annual VMATYC general business meeting will be held as a working lunch on Saturday April 1st.* We're looking for folks to lead a few pre-conference workshops on Friday morning, too!

Those of us who teach mathematics in Virginia are affected by the many changes driven by the Math Pathways initiative which can be traced to Complete College America's report "Remediation: Higher Education's Bridge to Nowhere," published in April 2012. We'll hear from one of the education reformers behind this initiative at our Friday kickoff beginning at 12:30 pm.

VMATYC is looking for presentations concerning the issues we faculty face during these challenging times. Consider presenting or conducting a workshop about general teaching pedagogy, use of technology for teaching, successful strategies to enhance the achievement of both developmental and transfer mathematics, interesting projects and assignments you are using in your classroom (in person and online), strategies for coping with and managing change, or any other topic you believe would be valuable to share with your colleagues. 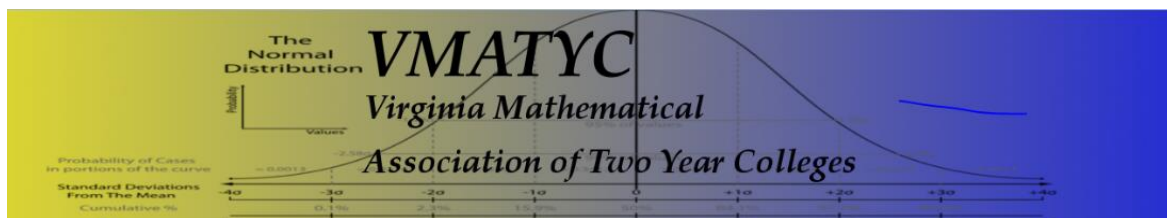

The VMATYC Glenn Fox memorial Mathematics and Computer Science Scholarship Committee is seeking qualified applicants for the 2017-2018 academic year. The scholarship award is for \$500 per semester.

In order to be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must:

- 1) Intend to major in mathematics, computer science, or mathematics education and demonstrate potential for success in any of these areas.
- 2) Demonstrate ability, determination, and motivation necessary for successful academic performance.
- 3) Have completed at least 12 semester hours of college-level courses, including 3 hours of transfer mathematics at a Virginia community college, by the end of the spring semester with a GPA of 3.2 or higher.
- 4) Continue for two semesters (fall-spring of the award year) at a Virginia community college and enroll in at least 6 semester hours of college-level courses, including a transfer-level mathematics course, for each semester the scholarship is received. Preference is given to those candidates who intend to teach mathematics or computer science.

Specific details concerning the application requirements and process, including the application form, can be found on the VMATYC website www.vmatyc.org. Applicants must complete the application, provide official transcripts of college work, and send three letters of reference. All information is submitted electronically.

Complete Application Packets are due no later than June 2, 2017.

VCCS mathematics and computer science faculty members are urged to identify deserving students who are eligible for the scholarship and make them aware of the scholarship! In particular, those of us teaching precalculus and calculus students in their first year of community college are encouraged to make a special effort to identify promising students and encourage them to apply for the scholarship.

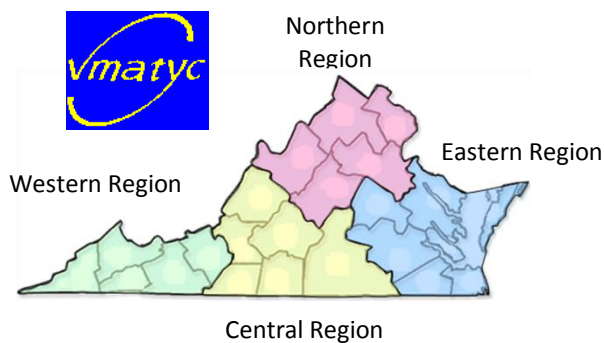

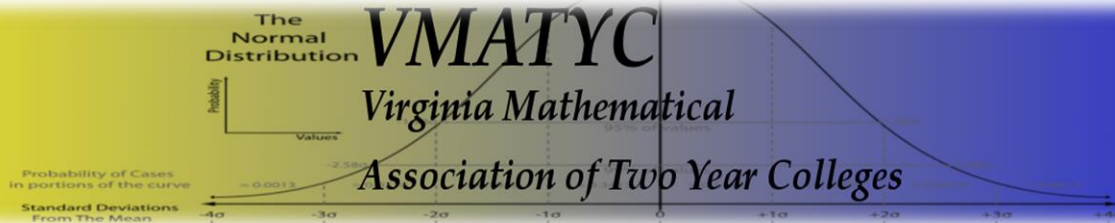
